Members' Workshop

AGRODEP held its second workshop for members in June 6-8, 2011 at the Novotel Hotel in Dakar, Senegal. The workshop brought together 43 AGRODEP members and 21 other participants including guest speakers, members of the AGRODEP Scientific Advisory Board (SAB), and members of the Steering Committee (SC). The event provided AGRODEP members with an opportunity to present their ongoing research, exchange ideas, and attend expert sessions on analytical tools used to study three research topics, Climate Change, Food Prices and Price Volatility, and Foreign Direct Investment in Land.

Scientific Advisory Board (SAB) and Steering Committee (SC) Meetings

The SAB and SC held their first meetings on June 9, 2011 following the members' workshop in Dakar, Senegal. These two committees support AGRODEP's scientific, policy, and operational functions by providing advice to the AGRODEP Management team. More specifically, the role of the Scientific Advisory Board (SAB) is to offer expert advice to the Consortium on i) scientific topics and approaches; ii) institutions in and outside Africa that can contribute to AGRODEP's objectives; iii) scientific pertinence of research projects developed by AGRODEP members; and iv) improvements and/or innovations on analytical methodologies. The Steering Committee (SC), on the other hand, guides AGRODEP on key matters of policy, operational issues, and resource mobilization. In addition, the Committee ensures that the initiative remains focused on its objectives and mission, is run effectively, and recommends strategies and actions to increase the effectiveness and impact of AGRODEP. The Committees met to discuss their roles and responsibilities in supporting AGRODEP. Each committee approved its terms of reference. In addition, the Steering Committee reviewed and approved the 2011 workplan, membership extension plan, and the grants program which AGRODEP plans to launch soon.
