"Credit Constraints and Agricultural Productivity in Developing Countries: The Case of East Africa"

AGRODEP has published a new Working Paper, the 40th in its [Working Paper series](#).

"Credit Constraints and Agricultural Productivity in Developing Countries: The Case of East Africa" was written by [Bethuel Kinyanjui Kinuthia](#). The paper examines how credit impacts agricultural productivity in East Africa, as well as how efficiency losses are associated with credit constraints. The data is based on the Living Standards Measurement Study-Integrated Surveys on Agriculture for Tanzania and Uganda.

The results show that credit affects agricultural productivity in the region through various channels and in different ways in the two countries covered by the data. Overall, farm size, extension services, and non-farm income appear to impact agricultural productivity. In addition, the results show that most rural households continue to rely on informal credit systems rather than on formal or semi-formal systems. The paper concludes with several recommendations to increase households' access to credit and overall productivity.
