## New Technical Note and Toolbox: Methods for Updating and Balancing Social Accounting Matrices

The new AGRODEP Toolbox on Methods for Updating and Balancing Social Accounting Matrices was launched in October 2019 along with the release of Technical Note 17: A Comparative Analysis of Methods for Updating and Balancing Social Accounting Matrices. The technical note is currently available in French, with an English version soon to follow.

The toolbox and accompanying note guide users through four methods for updating and balancing SAMs, including cross-entropy, ordinary least squares, Huber, and Hellinger methods, allowing for comparison. An example is given using Rwanda SAMs from 2006 and 2011.

## AGRODEP members author chapters in the AATM 2019

AGRODEP members Senakpon Fidele Dedehouanou, Cheickh Sadibou Fall, Albert Makochekanwa, and Chahir Zaki coauthored chapters in the recently launched Africa Agriculture Trade Monitor (AATM 2019). A collaboration between the International Food Policy Research Institute (IFPRI) and the Technical Centre for Agricultural and Rural Cooperation (CTA) and edited by Antoine Bouet and Sunday Odjo, the AATM 2019 builds on the work of the Regional Strategic Analysis and Knowledge Support System (ReSAKSS) and AGRODEP on trade.

Mobilizing the most detailed statistical knowledge and technically robust tools, the AATM 2019 identifies the most important barriers to more integrated trade in Africa, identifies which African regional trade agreements have worked and which have failed, and determines which sectors in Africa are most competitive and examines the characteristics of sectoral specialization. It also assesses the possible consequences of a more protectionist global economy for Africa. It provides clear policy recommendations for current trade integration efforts on the continent.

Chahir Zaki, an AGRODEP member from Egypt since 2012 and co-author of the chapter on intra-African trade integration with Sunday Odjo and Fousseini Traore, opined: "Being an AGRODEP member, I was honored to be part of the AATM team. A very rich learning experience on Africa's trade policy that helped me understand why there is a huge potential in this continent."
