E-learning course on Impact Evaluation from the Food Security Portal

An e-learning course on Impact Evaluation is now available to AGRODEP network members and to the public from the Food Security Portal's e-learning platform. The course explains the different stages and aspects in implementing a project evaluation, from including a counterfactual or control group in the evaluation design to selecting the most appropriate method based on the nature of the program, the outcomes of interest and the data that can be collected. The Impact Evaluation course is the first in a planned series of free elearning courses from the FSP's e-learning platform. The FSP is grateful to five AGRODEP members who beta tested the course.

The e-learning platform is part of the recently launched revamped Food Security Portal. New tools and features of the FSP and the Africa South of the Sahara sub-portal, which are available in English and in French, were introduced in the revamped website. These new features include the Early Warning Hub and a Control Panel for Risk Monitoring. The COVID-19 Food Price Monitor, which includes daily prices of key food commodities in East African countries, are among the tools made available in a COVID-19 page that is dedicated to tools and resources for tracking and analyzing the potential impacts of the pandemic.

English version of Technical Note on Methods for Updating and Balancing Social Accounting Matrices

AGRODEP published the English version of Technical Note 17: A Comparative Analysis of Methods for Updating and Balancing Social Accounting Matrices which documents the Toolbox on Methods for Updating and Balancing Social Accounting Matrices. The technical note was previously available only in French.

The toolbox and accompanying note guide users through four methods for updating and balancing SAMs, including cross-entropy, ordinary least squares, Huber, and Hellinger methods, allowing for comparison. An example is given using Rwanda SAMs from 2006 and 2011.
