AGRODEP at the 2014 GTAP Conference

The 17th Annual GTAP Conference was held last week in Dakar. Senegal. AGRODEP co-organized the event with the Global Trade Analysis Project at Purdue University, and the Consortium was well represented, with 28 members attending and 15 presenting their work. The conference attracted 194 researchers from 52 countries, with 50 of the participants coming from Africa. Forty of those African scholars were supported by scholarships from AGRODEP, UNECA, WTO, and IFPRI's Food Security Portal.

The conference was sponsored and supported by the CGIAR Research Program on Policies, Institutions and Markets (PIM), IFPRI's Food Security Portal, UNECA, the World Bank, and the WTO. The theme of this year's conference was "New Challenges in Food Policy, Trade, and Economic Vulnerability," with a particular focus on sustainable economic growth in Africa. Excellence in Publications Award

Recently Completed AGRODEP Training Courses

The AGRODEP training course program continued this spring with a full schedule of courses. "Experimental Methods for Impact Assessment," instructed by Angelino Viceisza of Spelman College and IFPRI, was held May 26-27 and was attended by 14 members. The "Impact Evaluation and Analysis of Development Interventions" series continued in June with Part III, which was instructed by Susan Godlonton of IFPRI and Michael Anderson of the University of California, Berkeley; the course was attended by 11 members.

Two advanced CGE modeling courses were held in tandem with the GTAP Conference in order to encourage more AGRODEP members to participate in the conference. The first session, "Advanced CGE Modeling: PEP and IFPRI Models" was held on June 16-17 and attended by 14 members. This session was instructed by Ismael Fofana and Fousseini Traore of IFPRI. The second session took place on June 22 and focused on "Models of Regional Trade Integration." This session was coorganized by the World Bank. It was attended by 13 members and was taught by Thomas Rutherford of the University of Wisconsin and David Tarr, a consultant with the World Bank.
