Second Annual AGRODEP Workshop

The second annual workshop of AGRODEP members will be held from June 6-8, 2011 in Dakar, Senegal. The workshop provides an opportunity for scientific exchange and collaboration among members and explores state of the art methodologies and tools used to address key research topics such as <u>Climate Change</u> and <u>Food Prices and Price Volatility</u>. In addition to AGRODEP members' presentation of their research projects, the workshop will bring together leading experts to discuss selected research topics and the wide range of methodological approaches and tools that can be used to study them. Among others, a session on Climate Change will focus on methodologies used to study mitigation and adaptation issues, and a parallel session on Food Prices and Price Volatility will provide an overview of the international food prices and focus on tools used to measure price volatility, <u>price transmission</u> from international to local markets, and impacts of changes in international prices on households. The members' workshop will be followed by meetings of the AGRODEP <u>Steering Committee (SC)</u>, <u>Scientific Advisory Board (SAB)</u>, and <u>Network Advisory Committee (NAC)</u>.

Open Atrium for Members

At the beginning of 2011, AGRODEP created Open Atrium accounts for its members in order to facilitate interaction among them and with AGRODEP management through the blog space and document sharing.

Capacity Building Questionnaire

In January 2011, AGRODEP designed and implemented a capacity building needs questionnaire which will help in planning future training activities for its members.

Dr. MOUNIR BALLOUMI, University of Sousse, Tunisia
