

AGRODEP Membership Extension

Membership in 2010

The first round of AGRODEP membership selection in 2010 drew mostly from a large pool of African researchers belonging to the Global Trade Analysis Project (GTAP) and the Poverty and Economic Policy (PEP) research networks. Individual African researchers were identified and invited to apply for AGRODEP membership using an extensive questionnaire.

A two-step selection process was employed. First, the applicants were screened based on two essential criteria:

- Applicant must be based in Africa
- Applicant must have obtained a Ph.D. within the last 15 years, is a Ph.D. candidate, or has a Masters degree with technical skills and experience.

Following the initial screening, the second set of criteria included the level and nature of applicants' technical skills and publications. And finally, in order to ensure a gender balance and appropriate geographical representation from various regions of Africa, a gender and geographic criterion was applied.

This selection process led to 29 applicants that were accepted as members of the AGRODEP research consortium in 2010 (Annex 1). In terms of gender breakdown, this pool includes 19 men and 10 women. In addition, in terms of geographic representation, the team includes the following: 9 researchers from West Africa, 8 from East Africa, 6 from North Africa, 4 from Southern Africa, and 2 from Central Africa. The majority of members belong to national research institutions (10) and universities (10). Members from Africa-based international institutions (7) as well as working with government institutions (2) are also represented. Slightly less than one-third of the 53 African countries are represented in the current AGRODEP membership; in other words out of 16 countries represented, 5 are located in West, 5 in East, 3 in North, 2 in Southern Africa and 1 in Central Africa. Two-thirds of the selected members have CGE modeling background and all members except three have expressed an interest in trade issues.

Objectives of the Extension

AGRODEP aims to extend its membership in order to reach a critical mass of economic modeling experts within Africa's policy research and analysis community, and to allow for greater diversity in its membership profile and improved geographical distribution within Africa. The extension of the membership is scheduled in three phases in order to reach the following number of members:

- 50 members in 2011
- 75 members in 2012
- 100 members in 2013

Extension Agenda

- A message will be prepared and disseminated through an outreach list for information about the second round of selection by March 1. The list includes African research centers and universities (Annex 3), the members and the representatives of the SAB, the SC and the Network Advisory Committee of AGRODEP (Annex 2), and a list of individuals and institutions that have expressed interest in AGRODEP –the partners and friends of AGRODEP (Annex 4).
- AGRODEP will accept applications over two weeks following the dissemination of the message, i.e. March 31, 2011.
- The information will be compiled and the selection process will take place in **April 1**, **2011**.
- AGRODEP will send a response letter to selected-applicants by April 30, 2011. The
 AGRODEP Letter of Agreement will also be sent to the selected members, along with the
 response letter. The former must be signed and returned to AGRODEP by May 31, 2011.
- At the end of the selection process (May 31, 2011), AGRODEP will also send response letters to non-selected applicants.
- The scheduled activities for 2011 will start from **May 2011**, **2011** with the participation of the new members.

Selection Committee

A committee is created every year carry out the selection of the new members. The number of new members is determined after the de-selection process¹ has taken place. The selection committee is composed of:

- The Project Manager
- The Deputy Project Manager
- The Data Coordinator
- The Models Coordinator
- The Network Coordinator
- One representative from AGRODEP members

Selection Criteria

- 1. Location criteria: AGRODEP members must be African-based researchers
- 2. Education and professional experience criteria:
 - o Ph.D. defended within the last 10 years, or
 - Ph.D. student for at least 3 years, or
 - Masters degree holder in economics with 3 (lower bound) to 15 (upper bound) years of professional experience;
- 3. Research experience criteria, assessed on the basis of:
 - Publications (top 5 papers submitted by the candidate),
 - Training and workshops completed.
- 4. Diversity criteria; diversity in terms of regional, gender, and scientific interest will be insured.

Selection Procedure

- First, the selection committee makes the initial selection based on the criteria of location and education.
- Then, each committee member proposes a list of their selected candidates based on the
 research experience and the required number of new members. Any Candidate listed by
 at least half of the committee members is selected as AGRODEP member in this second
 cut.

 Lastly, positive discrimination is applied to ensure diversity. The membership is raised by adding more representatives of under-represented groups (region, gender, scientific interests, etc.) to restore a certain balance. Candidates are selected from the lists proposed by the committee members.

Review of Member Activities and De-selection Procedure

- The activities of each member will be reviewed every two years of their membership in AGRODEP. The review will be conducted by the Project Manager and the Network Coordinator, who will then submit their findings to the selection committee in an annual report during the **fourth quarter of the year**.
- The committee will also submit to the SC the list of members to be considered for deselection as a result of not fulfilling their responsibilities over the <u>last two years</u> as per agreement with AGRODEP. This is also done during the **fourth quarter of the year**.
