#### **2012 AGRODEP Special Call for Membership**

The fourth round of AGRODEP membership extension was launched on October 1, 2012 and has already attracted a large number of high quality applicants from throughout Africa. New members will be selected based on a combination of factors, including their level of education, experience, and technical skills. Increasing membership will contribute to the Consortium's objective of mobilizing a critical mass of modeling experts within Africa's policy research and analysis community. This special round of membership extension strongly encourages applications from researchers who are engaged in or are strongly interested in learning more about impact evaluation.

AGRODEP membership is offered exclusively to African researchers living in Africa. Members gain free access to cuttingedge economic research tools, data, and training as well as opportunities to apply for competitive research grants.

#### Competitive grant proposals to address gaps in research

On May 22, 2012, AGRODEP launched its first call for grant proposals to cover gaps in research. This series of grants supports research regarding emerging issues in Africa that have previously received little or no attention. The selected topic for this year was "Foreign Direct Investment in Land (FDI), Land Markets and Land Institutions, and Development of the Agricultural Sector in Africa". AGRODEP received a total of 75 proposals in this call. Due to the high number of applicants and the high caliber of each proposal, the selection process took longer than initially anticipated. Each proposal was read and evaluated thoroughly with conformity to the requirements of the call and progressed to quality of the

#### **2012 SAB and SC Meetings**
